Karen Harris has been the owner, operator of Foothills Nursery and Herbs in Mt. Airy NC. since 1993. Ms. Harris has an eclectic taste in plants. She began with culinary herbs due to a love for cooking and things quickly accelerated into nearly every corner of the gardening world. Rambling around her nursery will reveal everything from conifers to pitcher plants. Her vast array of plants include oddball shade plants and plants that she grows on the line between Zones 6 and 7 just to prove to other nurserymen that she can! She will be sharing her penchant for shade plants and their surprising resilience under trees that grace your garden.



Cindy Shapton is a writer, speaker, herbalist, designer, and master gardener. When she is not speaking and writing, she works in her large kitchen garden on her homestead near Franklin, TN. Cindy also teaches classes on growing food and herbs, making remedies and foraging for native food and medicine on her farm. Known as The Cracked Pot Gardener; the title of a column Cindy wrote for the Williamson Herald. Cindy writes articles for many magazines and is a regular contributor for State-by-State Gardening. She is the former owner of Hyssop Hill Herb Farm in Franklin, TN and the past president of the Williamson County Master Gardeners. Cindy is the author of *The Cracked Pot Herb Book: Simple Ways to Incorporate Herbs into Everyday Life*; it is available on her website — www.cindyshapton.com.



Mary Stickley-Godinez has degrees in Horticulture and Landscape Design. While acquiring these degrees, she worked as Inventory Manager for a perennial nursery, Producer of a call-in radio talk show about plants, Enhancements Manager for a landscape maintenance company, and as Plant Purchaser, Production Manager, Designer's Assistant, and Landscape Designer for various design/ build companies. She has also worked as Greenhouse Manager for a retail garden center, and owned her own landscape design/install company. She acquired the International Arborist Certification. She is an active member of Piedmont Master Gardener Association, Central Shenandoah Valley Master Gardeners Association, Dogwood Garden Club in Charlottesville and Old Fredericktown Garden Club in Winchester. After 9 years as Manager of Gardens and Grounds for the Museum of the Shenandoah Valley, Mary married and, in early 2014, with her husband, bought a farm in Crimora. This location became the home base for their business, Countryside Farm and Nursery, LLC. They purchased a second farm in spring, 2016. They raise fruit trees which they sell wholesale, and also raise and sell fruit and vegetables for their farm stand. As part of their business, they also graft and bud trees for other orchards. Mary also owns and operates Countryside Garden Consultations, providing ideas and information to assist homeowners in their gardening endeavors. And, she writes on gardening topics for various publications, lectures, and teaches seminars throughout Virginia.
